proud – a truly wonderful afternoon.










Jubilee Book Box Bonus!

Children produced some super sketches, learned about a career in illustration and had lots of fun at the same time.






Royal Writing Really Rocks

On Tuesday 5th July Year 5 children visited the factory and foundry at Thomas Dudley – local leading manufacturing business.



An exciting and interesting afternoon allowed children to see for themselves how many D U D L E Y everyday objects are designed and made. The visit also inspired and informed our pupils

about how to pursue a career in design and engineering. Children toured the factory

and foundry, seeing a variety of everyday products being made from metals and plastics.

Here at Blowers Green we encourage our children to 'dream big' so it was very exciting to meet with Chief Executive Martin Dudley who shared his own inspiring career experiences with the children. There was also the opportunity to meet with a range of Thomas Dudley employees carrying out a



range of roles within the company who discussed their own career pathways and qualifications needed to work in the different positions within the company. It was so interesting to see how products are designed, refined and developed and how staff have used creative ways to solve problems to make further improvements to the products available. Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Science (STEAM) influence everyone's everyday lives. First Class First Aiders

Year 6 Learn First Aid Basics.

During the Summer Term Year 6 children completed a day of first aid training at the Dudley Institute of Technology. The opportunity to learn basic First Aid is a vitally important life skill that supports children's own and others' health and wellbeing. The training was delivered by the first aid training company *Mini Medics*, who equipped children with the knowledge, confidence and understanding to support someone who requires first aid. Children learned how to risk assess situations to ensure their own safety but to also assist others who may have cuts bruises or stings. The training also taught children how no bandage limb and head injuries as well as how to make emergency calls confidently. Children were also introduced to the recovery position and the important role it can play in saving someone's life. All children that completed the training received a certificate and more importantly gained an important life skill.

In addition to this, The Institute of Technology provided the children with a tour of the facility to see all the state-of-the-art equipment and modern apparatus. The Institute of Technology is a wonderful facility that inspired many of the children to be doctors, dentists, surgeons, engineers and designers of the future.
