

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As those autumnal nights draw in why not snuggle up with a good book. Here are some seasonal stories that will that will engage and interest...




STAFF PICKS Hear about all the wonderful books the adults in school have been reading. Mrs Martin Recommends Dctober, October By Katya Balen

'October, October' by Katya Balen is a heart-warming and magical story that takes you on a journey filled with emotions and adventure. The book explores the challenges faced by the outsider, those who don't quite fit into a neat box, but how it's still possible for everyone to find companionship. We also experience the joy of reconciliation.

To begin with, I must admit that I was drawn in by the illustrations and the lovely warm colours on the cover, however it is the story inside which is the really warming aspect of this book.

October lives with her father deep in the woods; her mother, unable to cope with living 'wild', left when October was small and although she does try to keep in contact with her daughter, October doesn't want to have anything to do with her mother. October has never gone to school and spends all of her time with her father, and her new-found pet owl, Stig. She is extremely close to him and is distraught when a serious accident, from falling out of a tree, leaves him hospitalised and unable to look after her. October is even more distraught when she has to go to stay in London with her mother. Forced to go to the local school, she finds it very difficult to fit in and her time there is only made bearable by the friendship that ten-



tatively builds between her and another pupil with whom she goes mud larking on the River Thames. However, October's relationship with her mother leaves much to be desired and missing not only her father but also her pet owl, which has now had to be housed at a bird sanctuary, October struggles to cope with the changes in her life. Will her father recover sufficiently to enable them to return to the woods that she and he both love? Or will October be forced to stay in London with a mother she barely knows?

'October, October' is a book that made me feel all kinds of emotions. I laughed, I felt sad, and I even got a little scared at times. But most importantly, it made me feel happy and hopeful. It reminded me that even when things are tough, there's always room for hope, wonder and magic in our lives.

but they always stick together, and that's a great message.




Just a Book? By Joshua Seigal


A brilliant collection of poems by an exciting young poet, this book is perfect, whether you like poetry or not!
